SIEMdig Prepares for Final Meeting and LTTA: Platform Now Hosting Digital Tools and Interactive Stories

The Erasmus+ project SIEMdig - Social Inclusion and Emotional Maturity of the Society's youngest participants helped by digitally competent teachers is entering its final stage, set to conclude in November 2025. After almost two years of collaboration, the consortium is now preparing for the Final Transnational Project Meeting and the Learning, Teaching, and Training Activity (LTTA).

Upcoming Final Meeting & LTTA

The Final Meeting will bring together all partners to reflect on achievements, evaluate impact, and ensure sustainability of results.

At the same time, the LTTA will focus on piloting the Teacher Training Modules created during the project. These modules, compiled in the SIEMdig Teacher Training Guide, are ready to equip teachers with digital competences and inclusive pedagogical practices.

They cover key areas such as:

- Navigating the SIEMdig Digital Repository,
- Using the Interactive Digital Storytelling Platform,
- Designing inclusive classroom activities,
- Promoting empathy and emotional intelligence,
- Engaging families and communities.
